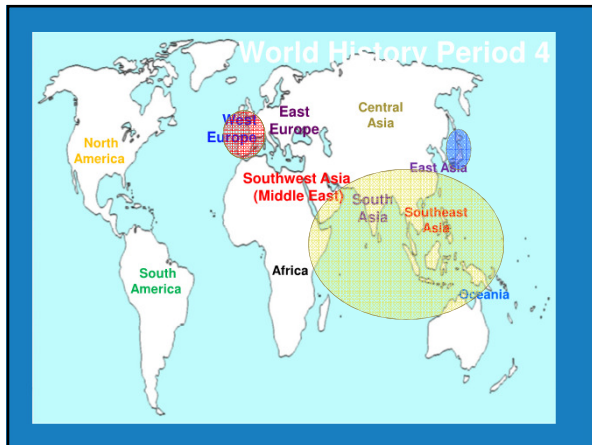

2. Highest prices for spices

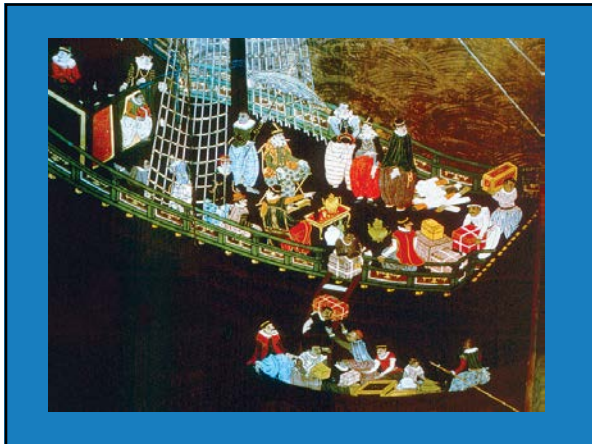


Dutch vs. Portuguese

1. Portuguese trade empire declined
2. Dutch emerged over England
3. Portuguese: aggressive traders
4. Dutch: peaceful traders

Japanese Isolation and the Tokugawa Shogunate

1. Tokugawa became daimyo
2. Family's rule lasted 2 1/2 centuries
3. Cut country off from new ideas
4. Banned Christianity and western books
5. Wanted to keep their integrity

2. Missionary activity in Asia
